

What are opioids?

Opioids are a group of drugs that includes illegal substances like heroin and prescription pain relievers like oxycodone, hydrocodone, codeine, morphine, and fentanyl.



Opioids can affect your brain and spinal cord to reduce the intensity of pain, control areas that regulate emotions, and cause euphoria or "High". They can be dangerous when misuse.

Opioids slow down the actions of the body, such as breathing and heartbeat. Using too much can slow or stop breathing, which can lead to death.







Opioids, like heroin, are highly addicting. Addiction means it is very difficult to stop

More people struggle with addiction to prescription pain relievers. Many young people who are heroin users started with misuse of prescription opioids.

Whether opioids are prescribed by a doctor or acquired legally, they can cause serious changes to the brain and body.



Know the Signs

How will you know if someone or your loved one is misusing opioids?

- Feeling of "High", pleasure
- Weight loss or weight gain
- Itchy skin, scabs, clammy skin
- Quick, involuntary muscle jerks
- Intense flu-like symptoms (nausea, vomiting, shaky hands, feet, head)
- Dilated or constricted pupils
- Drowsiness, sleepiness, nodding off
- Non responsiveness, deep sleep
- Slowed breathing, loud snoring, hypoxia



SPREAD THE WORD about opioid misuse, you don't know whose life you are going to save.
